Chris Newlin, MS LPC, is the Executive Director of the National Children's Advocacy Center where he is responsible for providing leadership and management of the NCAC and participating in national and international training and leadership activities regarding the protection of children. The NCAC was the first Child Advocacy Center in the United States, and continues to provide both prevention and intervention services for child abuse in Huntsville/Madison County, and also houses the NCAC National Training Center, the Southern Regional CAC, and the Child Abuse Library Online (CALiO). In these capacities, Chris oversees a staff of 48 professionals and a yearly budget of 5 million dollars. He has worked in both urban and rural Children's Advocacy Centers; and currently serves on the National Children's Alliance Board of Directors, and Alabama Network of Children's Advocacy Centers Board of Directors; and is a member of the International Society for the Prevention of Child Abuse and the Association for the Treatment of Sexual Abusers. Chris graduated from Hendrix College, the University of Central Arkansas, and the Harvard Business School Executive Education Program.
