There are 8 million children in Canada, and 1/3 of them do not enjoy a safe and healthy childhood.



**1 in 3** Canadians have experienced abuse before their 15<sup>th</sup> birthday.





Suicide is now the leading cause of death for

children aged 10 to 14.



### increase


in specific conversations about **physical**, **sexual** and **emotional abuse**.



As kids go back to school, reports of suspected child abuse may increase, since children will be interacting with trusted adults in their schools.



### Missing school: big worries for children aged 10 to 17



### 3 in 10 put the prospect of missing out on more school

## NATIONAL LOCKDOWN & THE IMPACT TO EDUCATION

- Inequitable access to childcare and education
  - Patchwork of approaches across the country
  - Lack of access to technology & bandwidth
- Schools as a gateway to other rights (protection from violence, mental health, food security, physical activity, recreation/play, etc.)
- Loss of employment for parents caring for children and supporting educational needs
- Children's lack of involvement in policy making and decisions around returning to school





### CALL TO ACTION



Appoint a federal Commissioner for Children and Youth



Create a national strategy to tackle the top 10 threats to children in Canada and ensure the full protection of children's rights



Publish a children's budget that includes dedicated resources to address the top 10 threats to children in Canada, as well as \$250 million to mitigate the impact of COVID-19 on children

### Commissioner for Children and Youth in Canada Act

Senator Rosemary Moodie's Public Bill S-210 would establish the Office of the Commissioner for Children and Youth in Canada.

The Commissioner for Children and Youth in Canada would have a mandate to advocate for the promotion and protection of the rights and well-being of children and youth, particularly those who belong to a vulnerable group.




### BACK TO SCHOOL AND COVID-19: NEW POLL

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






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### OF CANADIAN PARENTS HAVE A CHILD WHO HAS BEEN SENT HOME FOR COVID RELATED SYMPTOMS




