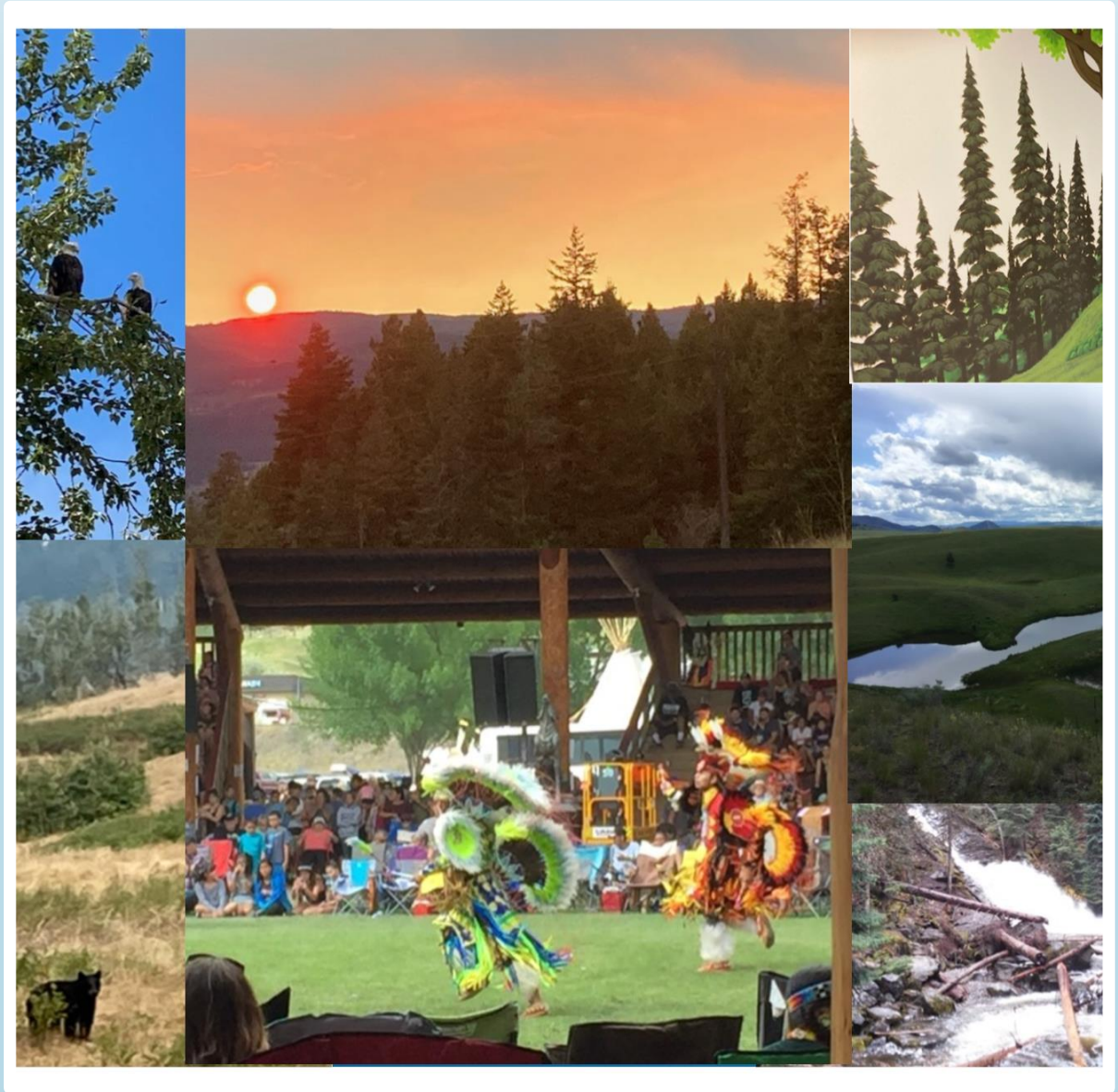

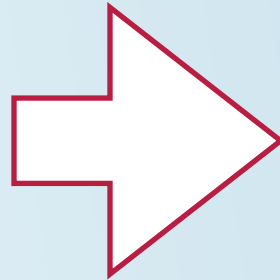
Acknowledging and Honouring Traditional Territories
