A MESSAGE FROM THE CHAIR AND THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR



Building a world free of sexual violence toward children and adolescents

In 2016-2017, the Foundation set down solid footings for building a world free of sexual violence. We developed and significantly diversified our range of services to reach a greater number of young people.

//Preventing sexual violence

In the past year, the Foundation kicked off two major prevention projects.

The first, the **Lantern Project**, funded by **Avenir d'enfants**, focuses on **education about healthy sexuality and egalitarian relationships** for young children aged from birth to five. It was developed in collaboration with our partners in Montérégie, Montréal and the Atikamekw community.

The second project, **NON à la cyberviolence sexuelle pour nos jeunes** (No to sexual cyberviolence for our young people), aims to raise awareness among high school youth, school principals, teachers, professionals and parents about the issue of online sexual violence. In collaboration with adolescents from schools in Laval, Montérégie and Montréal, we are building promising prevention strategies.

//Supporting adolescents' victims of sexual violence

In a major step forward for the Foundation, in summer 2016 we received major funding that will allow us to offer specialized services to adolescents victims of sexual violence for the next three years. In the last year, we have adapted our clinical tools and the treatment we provide to children so that we could open our doors to our first adolescents clients starting in April 2017.

//Collaborating with First Nations communities

We are continuing to collaborate with First Nations communities by sharing our expertise in working with child victims of sexual assault. We are focusing on their power to take action, their empowerment, so that they can better prevent sexual violence and also work with children who have been victimized.

//A new image

The Foundation has taken the opportunity offered by all these changes and major developments to review our image and logo. The Marvin bear remains at the centre of the Foundation's logo and imagery, alongside the children and adolescents who are the focus of our services. We also launched a new website, marie-vincent.org.

We must not neglect to mention the arrival of our new Executive Director, Jean-Pierre Aubin. For him, committing to the Marie-Vincent mission means dreaming that the violence that works in silence, that insinuates itself into the lives of children and adolescents, can be eradicated. With this in mind, he has chosen to fully invest in our mission.

We want to extend our warmest thanks to all the employees of Marie-Vincent Foundation, as well as to our partners and generous donors who are making it possible for us to build a world free of sexual violence.



SERVICES TO CHILDREN AND FAMILIES



PREVENTION

To help build a world free of sexual violence, Marie-Vincent Foundation has developed a prevention approach that took concrete form this year through the creation of a distinct team that is working on two projects: the Lantern Project and the NON à *la cyberviolence sexuelle pour nos jeunes* (No to sexual cyberviolence for our young people) project.

LANTERN Project

Funded by Avenir d'enfants for three years, the Lantern Project aims to prevent sexual violence toward young children. It focuses on education about healthy sexuality and egalitarian relationships.

NON À LA Cyberviolence Sexuelle pour Nos jeunes*

This project aims to raise awareness among adolescents, school principals, teachers, professionals and parents about the issue of online sexual violence. In 2017, we established our first partnerships to deploy the project in three schools in Montréal, Laval and Longueuil. We will reach more than 3,500 students.

We will build promising prevention strategies in collaboration with adolescents. Next, each school can establish a concrete, realistic, creative and original action plan for raising youth awareness of the issue. This strategy will take into account the reality of each school and the adolescents who attend it.

- train the next generation to pursue the advancement of knowledge.







L'histoire de Julie


